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

New Way of Observing the Commandments

Not long ago, the U.S. Catholic Conference of Bishops (USCCB) overwhelmingly approved the cause for sainthood of "Servant of God" Benedictine monk Marinus LaRue. He lived on two vocations. He was a heroic mariner, during the Korean War and later, a humble monk at St. Paul' s Abbey in Newton NJ.

First, he was the captain of a U.S. Merchant ship, the SS Meredith Victory, during the Korean War. One day, he received a telegram order to have his ship reported at the port of Hungnam ASAP. As they approached the port, artillery fire roared above them. US Army colonels came and told Captain LaRue that the enemy was closing the gap quickly. The captain and the crew knew the situation was critical because thousands of refugees were crammed onto the beach for as far as they could see. The colonels told the captain that in no way they could order him to take on any refugees, since the ship was equipped only to handle cargo and it would expose the ship to the minefield getting in and out. But asked if he would volunteer to take some of those refugees off the beach, and to confer with his officers and decide. He immediately, without looking, no hesitation, responded to the colonels. "I will take my ship in and take as many of the refugees as we

He swiftly unloaded all cargo from the ship and allowed as many refugees as could possibly fit into the five empty cargo spaces and onto the deck. Despite the extreme cold, lack of adequate food and water, communist submarines hunting for them, and constant shelling and fighting nearby, he managed to transport all 14,000 refugees 490 miles to south at Geoje Island safety on Christmas day with no injuries or death along with 5 additional people as 5 women gave birth during the treacherous two-day ordeal.

Captain LaRue and his crew knew that it was very possible that they weren't going to make it. But they saw those people on that shore waiting in deep freezing cold weather just to get on the ship for an opportunity to save their lives. They were willing to take the risk. I think that says a lot about those men who are willing to take that risk for those refugees.

His mission is remembered as a Christmas miracle and "One of the greatest marine rescues in the history of the world." Captain LaRue remained in command of the Meredith Victory until it was decommissioned in 1952.

He then disappeared for 47 years and showed up in a very unexpected place. It was a monastery, St. Paul's Abbey in Newton NJ. He became a Benedictine monk living as an ordinary monk for 47 years. He stayed silent and lived a life of prayer and service at the abbey for all those 47 years.

Bob Lunny was a second man on the ship who witnessed this miracle closest to the captain during the evacuation of Hungnam. Bob found the disappeared captain after a relentless pursuit and stayed in touch even after he became a Navy admiral. Bob said he was a man of great religion, and understanding of his faith. He told Bob that so many people would come and try to question him about the voyage and the trip. He did not care to speak about it because he said he just did the right thing. He did what he was supposed to do and it was not extraordinary. And Bob said to him, explain to my son Alexander how you could make that decision at the time when we met the army colonels and you chose to take the ship in. He said the answer is in the Holy Bible. And with that he reached over and touched the Bible, and he said the answer is here. No greater love has a man than to lay down his life for his friends.

Brother Marinus wrote later in a reflection. "I think often of that voyage. I think of how such a small vessel was able to hold so many persons and surmount endless perils without harm to a soul. And as I think, the clear, unmistakable message comes to me that on that Christmastide, in the bleak and bitter waters off the shore of Korea, God's own hand was at the helm of my ship." Brother Marinus LaRue died on Oct. 14, 2001. Upon his death, his story began to spread out to the world rapidly, inspiring so many people throughout the world to this date.

In the Gospel today, Jesus continues the Sermon on the Mount. He began the Sermon on the Mount two Sundays ago with proclaiming the Beatitudes, then this past Sunday - calling us you are the salt and the light of the world. Today, he is teaching us a new way of observing the commandments. The essential point of the new way is shifting the emphasis from the external rules of the 10 commandments, to inward motives going-on in our heart. He wants us to scrutinize the underlying reason and reflect and reconcile based on the universal principle of love. Jesus addresses one of 10 commandments, you shall not kill, in a new way. He suggests the new way – not to be angry with others. He calls for elimination of anger because anger would be the root cause of the kill. He demands a deeper sense of moral responsibility to identify and correct the root cause for the evil action in the first place. How could one eliminate anger? Through love. Recall the new command Jesus gave in John's Gospel: "This is my commandment: love one another as I love you (John 13:34)" So, the pivot of Jesus' moral teaching is love; He teaches us to focus on our inner heart, all -encompassing and loving.

Brother Marinus LaRue was able to relate himself with all those thousands and thousands refugees crammed onto the beach waiting and waiting in deep freezing cold weather as his brothers and sisters. He loved them as Jesus taught us to love. That is why without hesitation, he was able to jump right into the action to rescue them. Through that rescue, he deeply had an experience of God. The rest of his life was a lifelong reflection of unfolding what that meant to him.

Shortly in the Liturgy of the Eucharist, we are going to experience the love of God so that we can follow Jesus willingly in our daily living, and share the love of God we experienced with others when we go out.

Every single Mass in the Liturgy of the Eucharist, we are taken to go back in time to the hour of Christ to His passion when the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world, loved me and gave Himself for me and you and you and every one of us here. That's what the Mass is about.

We can experience that in the Eucharist God loves me and gives Himself for me for the redemption of my sins. I can share with others of this good news I experienced by living our life willingly and faith-
